

Major events return to Caerphilly

The BBC Proms in the Park and the Tour of Britain 2012 will return to Caerphilly once again this year.

These major national events will attract thousands of visitors to the area and will help put the county borough on the international map.

BBC Proms in the Park returns to Owain Glyndwr Playing Fields, Caerphilly on Saturday 8th September. BBC Cymru Wales, in collaboration with Caerphilly council, will entertain the promenaders with a magical-themed Prom.

Joining the UK-wide revelry of the Last Night of the Proms, the enchanting evening will be led by the BBC National Orchestra of Wales adding their musical fairy dust to the celebrations.

Then, on Friday 14th September elite cyclists from across the world will speed through the streets of the county borough for the 2012 Tour of Britain.

The competitors enter the area near Nelson and speed down to the finishing line in Caerphilly town centre. Caerphilly Mountain is a key challenge in the final stages of the leg as the cyclists endure TWO steep climbs to the top before racing down to the finish line in the shadow of the magnificent castle.

"We are delighted that these prestigious events are coming back to the Caerphilly county borough in September," said CCBC Chief Executive Anthony O'Sullivan. "We are keen to showcase the many attractions that we have to offer and these events will help promote the area on an international stage."







Reports of anti-social behaviour fall in Rhymney

The Rhymney Neighbourhood Policing Team and local Special Constables have been working to reduce anti-social behaviour since January 2012, resulting in a 40% decrease in reports.


