Shared Lives scheme success

A collaborative scheme which supports vulnerable adults across six local authorities in South East Wales celebrated its first anniversary recently. Currently this scheme is supporting 181 service users and 180 carers, making a real difference to their lives.

£200m transforming homes



Caerphilly county borough council will spend over £200 million improving local homes over the next few years. Last year (2012/13), the authority spent nearly £18m. Over the next financial year (2013/14) we will spend more than £13m with 40 streets benefiting from improvement works. In 2014/15 we will spend £30m when work on the external programme starts.

SmartCards hit 100,000



The Caerphilly SmartCard scheme has reached a major milestone, with the 100,000th member having recently signed up! With around 170,000 residents in area, the SmartCard scheme is well on its way to reaching every person who lives in the county borough. The initiative allows residents and visitors access to all of the Leisure Centres and Libraries across the county borough. Concessionary prices are also supported by the scheme.

Proms in the Park returns



The hugely popular BBC Proms in the Park will be returning to Owain Glyndwr Playing Fields, Caerphilly for the third time on Saturday 7th September. Wales will once again be part of the BBC Proms Last Night celebrations as the BBC National Orchestra of Wales brings the Proms in the Park to Caerphilly for an evening of spectacular performances in the open air, set against the backdrop of Caerphilly Castle.

School Meals Frozen

We committed an additional £80,000 to avoid increases in school meal prices once again this year and have also become the first local authority in Wales to be fully 'Appetite for Life' compliant.

Flood Action

Caerphilly was one of the first councils in Wales to have its Flood Risk Management Strategy approved by Welsh Government. Its aim is to help us and our partners prepare for, and reduce the risk of flooding in the future.

£2.8m Improving roads

A number of resurfacing schemes across the area have been boosted by £2.8m from the Welsh Government's Local Government Borrowing Initiative (LGBI). The money will be spent targeting footways, side streets and A roads which have deteriorated during the winter months.

The annual Big Cheese Festival comes to Caerphilly on 27th and 28th July with the usual mix of events, activities, music, dance and funfair rides for all the family. A spectacular fireworks display will kick things off on Friday 26th July with the main event taking place Saturday and Sunday.

The 'Get Caerphilly Online' campaign has reached a major milestone recently, by successfully supporting its 2,500th client in Caerphilly county borough to use the Internet.
