Outstanding volunteers

Landmark takes shape

Building work on a brand new community hub in the heart of Caerphilly town centre is set to be completed this autumn, bringing a range of first class facilities for residents and visitors alike. Work on a state-of-the-art Library and Customer Service Centre located on Twyn Square is expected to be completed by October this year with the facility likely to be open for business early in 2014.

Cheer the Cyclists

Elite cyclists from across the world will race through the streets of the county borough on 19th September during the Welsh leg of the Tour of Britain. We play host to the end of Stage Five of the race, which will again include two gruelling ascents of Caerphilly Mountain before the riders cross the finish line at the Castle.



Improving YOUR homes

The council recently invited tenders from suppliers of materials needed to complete the Welsh Housing Quality Standard programme of work. A 10 year partnership agreement has been offered to Robert Price Builders' Merchants, a family run Welsh SME with a long history of supplying materials for WHQS contracts. The Council will invest £210m up to 2019/20, to bring all the homes up to the WHQS.



Supporting front line staff

Caerphilly has become the first council in Wales to be officially accredited by The Living Wage Foundation. The authority has been named as a 'Living Wage Employer' for the commitment it has shown to providing lowest paid members of staff with the living wage, currently calculated at £7.45ph.



Spotlight on Ystrad Mynach

The council's Town Centre Management Team are now supporting Ystrad Mynach alongside the other key town centres in the area. New branding has been developed and businesses are being encouraged to get involved. The council's 'Unique Places' model of Town Centre Management, has already been successfully applied to Caerphilly, Blackwood, Bargoed and Risca town centres.
