



£110m boost for schools

Schools across the county borough will benefit from £110million of investment thanks to the next phase of a hugely successful funding programme.

The council's Cabinet has given the green light to the next stage of the Welsh Government's 21st Century Education and Schools programme.

Cllr Philippa Marsden, Cabinet Member for Education said, "These exciting 'Band B' proposals are among the most ambitious in Wales and will offer our pupils the facilities they deserve – learning environments fit for the 21st Century."

BAND A: 'Band A' of the programme has already been delivered in Caerphilly resulting in over £56million in investment. The key projects in 'Band A' include the new Islwyn High School in Oakdale, Idris Davies 3-18 School in Rhymney (below) & Y Gwyndy Welsh school campus in Caerphilly.

BAND B: The ambitious 'Band B' programme includes new school builds, amalgamations, school refurbishments and expansions at sites across the whole county borough.



“It is important to stress at this stage these are only proposals and consultation with all key stakeholders will be a critical part of the process as the plans develop over the next 7 years.” added Cllr Marsden.

FINES FOR FLY-TIPPING INCREASED TO £400

In its latest move to tackle environmental crime, Caerphilly County Borough Council is saying 'Enough is Enough' to those who illegally dispose of waste, by increasing the maximum on the spot fine that can be issued for fly-tipping offences to £400.

Increasing the Fixed Penalty Notice for fly-tipping to £400 with no early payment option reflects the severity of the offence of dumping unwanted waste. In one year alone (2016/17), the council received 1,992 reports of fly-tipping, which cost in excess of £150,000 to clear up.

Cabinet Member for the Environment and Public Protection, Cllr Eluned Stenner said, "Fly tipping blights our communities and it damages our environment. We hope this new move to increase the maximum on-the-spot fine limit to £400 will act as a deterrent to the small minority of people who think they can get away with fly-tipping.

"The £150,000 plus it costs us each year to clear up instances of fly-tipping could be much better spent on services elsewhere – there really is no excuse and to those who feel they are above the law, we say 'Enough is Enough.'

"I would encourage any members of the public who witnesses fly tipping, or have any information to contact the council so that we can continue to effectively clamp down on those who feel they have the right to misuse our green spaces."

'Enough is Enough' is the council's new campaign aimed at tackling environmental crime across Caerphilly county borough, including fly-tipping, dog fouling and littering.

Could you cut your Council Tax?

Council Tax is usually paid if you are over 18 and own or rent your home. However, there are circumstances where your bill could be lower.

Council Tax Reduction

If you are on a low income or claiming other benefits you may get money off your bill by claiming Council Tax Reduction (which has replaced Council Tax Benefit). You can get up to 100% reduction, depending on your household circumstances (eg the number of adults and/or children living with you) and your household income - this includes things like savings, pension, your partner's income. To make a new claim for a Council Tax Reduction you need to fill in an application form. You can apply for a Council Tax Reduction and Housing Benefit using the same form.

Council Tax Discounts and Exemptions

There are a number of different discounts and exemptions available, for example:

- **Single Person Discount** - You can get 25% off your bill if only 1 adult aged 18 or over is resident in the property.
- **Your full council tax bill is based on at least 2 adults living in a property.** Certain people are not counted when working out the number of adults who live in your home. Therefore, if only one adult lives at the property who counts towards council tax, your bill will be reduced by 25%.
- **Disabled person band reduction** - Your bill may be reduced if your home has certain features which are essential or of major importance to the wellbeing of an adult or a child with a disability.
- **Empty Properties and Property Exemptions** – You may be able to claim an exemption if your property is empty, or if the way it is used falls into one of the classes shown on the Council's website link below.

Ras yr Iaith, the only world-wide race that promotes the Welsh language is expanding and will end this year in Caerphilly Town.


This year the race, the third since its inception, will visit new areas of Wales, and will, for the first time, visit the North East and the South East of Wales.

The Race will start in Wrexham on the 4th of July and finish in Caerphilly on July 6th offering three full days of running, noise, energy and enjoyment while celebrating Welsh in communities across Wales.

Various organisations across Wales also benefit from the Race as the funding received will be distributed in the form of grants. The money raised by the last Race held in 2016 was shared, between about forty five Welsh-language organisations across the areas visited.

The Race is organized by Menterau Iaith Cymru with the Caerphilly section managed by Menter Caerffili. Lowri Jones, Chief Executive of Menter Caerffili, says:

"We are very happy to be able to welcome Ras yr Iaith to Caerphilly Borough this year and to spread the Race's message. In 2016 over £42,000 was raised in grants for organisations to promote the Welsh language in their areas. As an organisation that aims to increase the use of Welsh in communities across Caerphilly Borough it is pleasing to see the race growing every time and it can make a difference for Wales."



Everyone is very welcome to take part in Ras yr Iaith, groups of friends, schools, families, organisations or businesses can take part in the Race by running or supporting on the side of the road, by stewarding, or by sponsoring part of the Race. Fostering is the chance to make an important difference to a child's life. All types of families from all kinds of backgrounds can foster a child or group of children. The council is currently looking for more foster carers for children of all ages in Caerphilly county borough, who would be willing to help give them the very best start in life.

Cabinet Member for Social Care and Wellbeing, Cllr Carl Cuss said, "Foster carers really do make a huge difference to the lives of children and young people in their care. It can be extremely rewarding and right from the outset, carers are fully supported by our dedicated team. I would encourage anyone who may be interested in becoming a foster carer to get in touch with our team to find out more about how they can change a child's life – and in turn, enrich their own."



One of the council's existing foster carers agrees, adding: "Being a foster carer is the most rewarding job I've had. I am in awe of every child that has walked into my home; their ability to adapt and begin to grow is unbelievable. Each child brings their own challenges and rewards, and when you accept them and their experiences, the rewards for both them and you are so heart-warming."

There are various opportunities for foster carers to attend training courses, enabling them to learn and share good practice, discuss issues they may have and build skills and confidence, while meeting and socialising with other carers and professionals. The council also provides fees to foster carers for the vital work they carry out. Currently the council is considering implementing a revised fee structure, which if implemented, would bring Caerphilly more in line with other local authorities across South Wales. It is hoped this improved fee structure would also assist the council in recruiting more foster carers in future.

One of the young people currently in the council's care and seeking a foster placement said, "I loved being in my last foster home – it literally made my day every day. It can be very hard for a girl my age, and I would really love to have a foster home and be able to stay with someone who's going to look after me until I'm an adult."

Air quality update

Air pollution is a national concern and unfortunately we all contribute to the problem in some way.

The main cause of poor air quality is Nitrogen Dioxide from vehicle emissions. If pollution levels in a particular area exceed agreed levels, then the local authority declares an Air Quality Management Area. The local authority is then required to produce an action plan, along with key stakeholders, detailing how they are going to tackle the issue in future.

The local authority continues to work hard to improve air quality across the county borough and our main efforts are currently focused on two key sites – Caerphilly town centre and Hafod-yr-yngys Hill, both of which are Air Quality Management Areas and have air quality action plans associated with them to bring about compliance within these areas.

Hafod-yr-yngys is also one of the areas named within a national plan about air pollution produced by the Welsh Government and residents may be aware that there are ongoing legal proceedings against the UK and Welsh Governments regarding their efforts to tackle air pollution.

As a result, Ministers have made a firm commitment to improve air quality and are

currently consulting on plans for tackling roadside nitrogen dioxide concentrations.

In addition to this, Ministers have issued directions to the local authorities named within the national report (including Caerphilly Council) to undertake feasibility studies and come up with a preferred option for bringing about compliance in with the air quality standards in the shortest possible time. Caerphilly is working in close partnership with Welsh Government through this process and further updates will be made as this work progresses.

There are a few simple things that we can all do to help:

- **Avoid unnecessary car journeys – Use your feet or cycle and leave the car at home.**
- **Switch off your engine when stationary - Do not idle your vehicle unnecessarily, especially in residential areas and outside schools.**
- **Regularly service your car and keep your tyres inflated.**
- **Avoid having bonfires and dispose of waste properly.**

Focus on Food Safety

All food businesses operating within the Caerphilly county borough are subject to regular food safety inspections, to ensure that food is being handled and produced hygienically.

During the last 12 months the council's Food Safety Team made over 1,700 visits to food premises to inspect the standards of food hygiene during routine inspections and food sampling, or to investigate a complaint made by a member of the public for issues such as foreign objects in food, poor hygiene standards or complaints of pests at food premises. The team also offer advice to food businesses and provide guidance for those who are thinking of starting one.

A major part of the teams work is to issue Food Hygiene Ratings, ranging from **5** (very good) to **0** (urgent improvement necessary). The scheme allows customers to make more informed choices about where they choose to buy and eat food. Since the scheme was introduced in 2010 a significant number of premises have improved their hygiene standards and 95% of food businesses in Caerphilly currently have a rating of 3 or above.

Boost for Tourism

Tourist destinations throughout the county borough have had a successful 2017, with most destinations experiencing growth from the previous year.

Caerphilly welcomed a total of 1.89 million visitors to the county borough during 2017, bringing a total economic impact of £128 million to the borough. A whopping 277,000 people visited The Visitor Centre, Caerphilly during 2017, with friendly staff providing help and information for tourists as well as serving food and beverages and selling local products.

Cwmcarn Forest also proved popular, with 225,000 choosing to visit the beauty spot which offers glamping pods, a variety of walking routes, cycle tracks, a visitor centre and various family activities throughout the year. Historic tourist destination **Llancaiach Fawr Manor** saw more than a 12% increase in visitors last year (compared to 2016) with 66,000 people taking advantage of the interesting heritage on offer. The **Winding House Museum** in New Tredegar has seen a 6% increase in visitors during 2017, with keen historians visiting the museum to explore their exhibitions. Theatre and the arts were also well supported throughout 2017, with 31,500 audience members visiting **Blackwood Miners' Institute** to experience the venues fantastic programme of entertainment.

Applications are open for the Welsh Church Fund

Local communities and voluntary organisations are encouraged to apply for funding from the Welsh Church Fund.

Managed by the council, the fund offers registered voluntary societies, churches, chapels and movements and institutions which contribute towards local community life, the opportunity to apply for funding of up to £10,000.

Generally, successful projects costing £5,000 or less will be fully grant aided, and larger projects can also receive funding at a grant rate of 75% of costs above £5,000, up to a total maximum grant of £10,000. Applications should be for capital costs, such as site works, building refurbishments, building extensions, purchase of equipment and furniture, landscaping and purchase of land/buildings etc.

Deputy Leader and Cabinet Member with responsibility for finance, Cllr. Barbara Jones, said, "We highly value this fund and took a decision at Cabinet to increase the maximum grant available to applicants as we feel that the money is of great value to the local community. I would urge all of those who feel they would benefit from this grant to get in touch."

Roundabout Update

Work continues to progress well on the Pwll-y-Pant roundabout improvement scheme in Caerphilly.

Once completed, these major works will significantly improve capacity and reduce congestion at this key strategic junction in the future. The council and its main contractor, Walters UK Ltd, have responded positively to concerns from the community over recent months and have agreed a number of changes to the contract in order to limit disruption and ease traffic congestion.

This included using additional funding from Welsh Government to allow two lanes to be operational on the approach to the roundabout from the Llanbradach bypass. This change made a significant improvement to traffic flow through the area, but it is likely that the traffic arrangements will need to revert to single lane operation during August to allow essential works to be undertaken. Traffic tends to be lighter during the school summer holidays and major events such as the Big Cheese would have already taken place.

Parents are being urged to ensure that young children always wear appropriate swim nappies when visiting any of the council's pools. Children suffering from illness should also stay away until they are fully recovered.

Unfortunately there have been a number of incidents over recent months where pools have been forced to close due to 'accidents' in the water. These lead to lengthy closures in order for the water to be cleaned and treated before further use can be permitted. Pool users are inconvenienced, classes need to be cancelled and the disruption can cost the council thousands of pounds each year due to treatment costs and lost income.

"The message is simple – make sure your child wears appropriate swim nappies at all times and if they have an upset stomach please keep them out of the water until they are fully recovered," said Cllr Nigel George, Cabinet Member for Neighbourhood Services.
